
## CA Students To Attend "America's Nobel" Ceremonies

p to four Colorado Academy students will be chosen to attend the ceremonies for the Neustadt Prize, set for October 21-23, 2015 at the University of Oklahoma Norman campus. Commonly known as "America's Nobel," the prestigious Neustadt Prize is considered one of the most important American awards for literature. In the prize's 45-year history, 30 of its laureates, jurors or finalists have gone on to win a Nobel Prize.

In alternating years, the international literary prize is given for Children's Literature. The NSK Neustadt Prize for Children's Literature is intended to enhance the quality of children's literature by promoting writing that contributes to the quality of their lives. Made possible through the generosity of the Neustadt family (also a CA parent), this award is sponsored by World Literature Today and The University of Oklahoma. It is awarded every other year to a living writer with significant achievement, either over a lifetime or in a particular publication. The essential criterion for
